A JA Day event will take place on March 12, 2013 at John Paul II giving you the opportunity to volunteer and teach Junior Achievement's (JA's) financial literacy and work readiness curriculum in a condensed one day time frame. JA's activity-based programs are taught over the course of one school day (from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm) by teams of two or three volunteers. This program is a powerful team-building experience as well as a memorable community service project. The benefit for the school is a free program that meets educational standards, with minimal time taken from the classroom. Last year the children learned valuable information while having fun. The benefit for you is that you are able to spend time in the classroom with your child.

Junior Achievement will provide a volunteer booklet that provides step by step instructions and all of the needed educational materials for the children. A training session will be held if enough adult support is obtained.
